Charlotte Hobbs, the niece of Club25 member Neil, and her friend Carly Bilder took part in TrekFest 2021: a 25km trek across the Breacon


Beacons. It was a tough challenge but they were in the top 14% of finishers and completed the distance in under 6 hours. They raised over £570.
